The International Telework Academy (ITA) has announced a call for papers for the 11th International Telework Workshop hosted by the University of New Brunswick, Fredericton, New Brunswick, Canada. The four day event is entitled **e-Networks in an Increasingly Volatile World** and aims to encourage academic researchers and business practitioners to generate interactive dialogue and share ideas around the development and maintenance of computer-mediated networks. On the last day of the event is an open forum where academic research is shared with key practitioners that can comment on current topics in the fields of e-networks.

Workshop sessions will consist of papers that have been accepted by way of a double-blind review process.
